Clark prepared design guidelines for a private development along a 3.7 mile stretch of the Indian River Corridor (SR 442), a four-lane roadway leading into the City of Edgewater from I-95. The design guidelines identified three distinct areas of the corridor based on existing development patterns and proposed thematic elements for each. Clark also prepared amendments to the City's comprehensive plan and land development code to integrate the design guidelines into the City's and the County's codes.
